# Peninsular Malaysia












# Introduction

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It was only ten months ago since our successful trip to Taiwan in 2017 and this time we decided to go to Peninsular Malaysia to see Garnet and Rusty-naped Pitta plus the Mountain Peacock-Pheasant as quickly as possible. It was also a good opportunity to look for some missing Sundae species. We would focus on three areas, the Genting Highlands (for the Mountain Peacock-Pheasant), Fraser's Hill (Malayan Partridge, Malayan Whistling-Thrush, Black-Laughingthrush and Rusty-naped Pitta) and Taman Negara (lowland species like Garnet Pitta, Malayan Banded Pitta, Short-toed Coucal, Black-throated Babbler, White-necked Babbler, Large Wren-Babbler and Rail-Babbler). First we had a day birding in Dubai, which is covered in this report.

# **Itinerary**

We left Dubai at 21:35 with Emirates flight EK344. We were both very tired after a day birding in Dubai, so we slept the whole 7 hours.

Arrival at Kuala Lumpur at 8:30 hours. It took some time to get the plane in position and the 25 Febr docking failed three times. After an hour or so we could leave the plane, but we had to wait for another two hours to get our luggage. The car rental (Hawk) was quickly found however and at c 12:00 hours we could leave the airport and we headed straight to Bukit Tinggi. Our navigation system worked fine and soon we were driving north. The toll roads were a surprise to us, but after instructions from one of the ladies in the toll houses we bought a Touch-and-go card at a gas station, put c 30 ringgits on it and the problem was solved. At c 13:15 we arrived at the Colmar Tropicale and met James Eaton. We had lunch first in this strange village and next James showed us the very spot of the Mountain Peacock-Pheasant. First birds were Plume-toed Swiftlet, Redbellied Swallow, Asian Brown and Dark-sided Flycatcher and a calling Helmeted Hornbill. Suddenly we heard the call of a Rail-Babbler, we followed the source and after some exchange of sounds, the bird appeared a few meters in front of us! Next we went to the house of Adrian Lim, the person who discovered the Pheasants in 2013. We drank a beer on his porch of his beautiful house. He organized to have the gate to the Pheasant being opened before 7:00 hours and also he provided us with meal worms and corn. After saying goodbye to Adrian and James (who went to Canada next morning) we checked in in the Colmar Tropicale. In the last hours of daylight we birded at a clearing and to our surprise we had 3 Pin-tailed Parrotfinches! After sunset we had a good dinner and crashed at c 21:00 hours.

> In the morning we left the hotel at c 5:45 hours in darkness. We heard a Sunda Scops Owl and saw several Grey Nightjars. At 7:00 hours we positioned ourselves behind a large camouflage net and waited. Around 7:15 three birders arrived, having no clue where they were and were toddling around on the very place where we would expect the pheasants. We gave them directions and soon everyone was in position. At 7:38 the first Mountain Peacock-Pheasant arrived and we could observe them till 9:00. There were two males, a female and two younger birds which followed the female the whole time. The Ferruginous Partridge arrived only at 9:00 am, but gave excellent views. Other birds were White-rumped Shama, Orange-headed Thrush, and Siberian Blue Robin. Almost the whole time the Rail-babbler was whistling constantly. We left the area at 10:00 am. On our way to the car we found three Siamangs in a fruiting tree together with several Golden-whiskered and Sooty Barbets. We were in time for breakfast at the hotel and after that we checked out and at 12:00 we drove to Fraser's Hill. We arrived at the Gate of Fraser's Hill at around 14:45 and checked the area in daylight to find out what the best position was to wait for the Malayan Whistling Thrush. We flushed a Large Niltava from the stream and in the trees above us the first Chestnut-capped Laughingthrushes and Long-tailed Sibia's appeared. Next we tried to find Stephen's Place at the start of the Telecom Loop. We dropped our bags at Stephen's Place – with Black-throated Sunbird

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and Mountain Bulbul in the garden - and Stephen Hogg explained us where the Malayan Partridges came to feed. We arrived at the place at the Jalan Richmond at 15:30 hours and almost the first birds were two Malayan Laughingthrushes. Ten minutes later a Malayan Partridge arrived and started to feed on the corn we had put there. This lone bird was chased away by four other Malayan Partridges. We left the place at 16:00 hours and went straight to the famous Bishop's Trail. We walked the trail from north to south. Best birds were Mountain Fulvetta, Golden Babbler, White-throated Fantail, Lesser Shortwing, Lesser Racket-tailed Drongo, Red-headed Trogon, Long-tailed Broadbill and Black-browed Barbets. While walking back to the car, we came upon a feeding flock which hold two Sultan Tits, a wonderful male Black-eared Shrike-Babbler, Lesser Yellownape, Orange-bellied Leafbird, Bronzed Drongo, Streaked Spiderhunter and Everett's White-eye. We had dinner at Stephen's Place at 18:00, a little bit early for us as it was still daylight, so after dinner we walked the Telecom Loop to look for Siberian Thrush, but none showed up. Later in the garden of Stephen's Place a Brown Wood Owl and a Grey Nightjar made an appearance. Around 22:00 hours we went to sleep.

27 Febr

We had breakfast at 5:45 and left the hotel at 6:00. At 6:15 we positioned ourselves at the Gate for our vigil for the Malayan Whistling Thrush. We waited for an hour but nothing happened. We continued birding along the Bishop's Trail to search for Rusty-naped Pitta, one of our targets. Best birds this morning were Green Magpie, Large Scimitar Babbler (heard only), Lesser Shortwing, White-tailed Robin, Black-browed Barbet, Orange-headed Thrush, Bronzed Drongo, Sultan Tit, Black-eared Shrike-Babbler, Orange-bellied Leafbird and Rufous-browed Flycatcher. Next on the program was the 8 km long road between the Gap and Fraser's Hill to find Black Laughingthrush. It took us only 2 km walking uphill until we found a pair. Other birds were Crimson-winged and Banded Woodpeckers, Grey Wagtail, Blyth's Hawk Eagle, Green-billed and Chestnut-breasted Malkoha, Mountain Fulvetta, Golden Babbler, Pin-striped Babbler, Scaly-crowned Babbler and Grey-throated Babbler. In the afternoon we walked the whole **Telecom Loop** with best bird a female Siberian Thrush and just before Stephen's Place we finally had our first Silver-eared Mesia and Blue-winged Minla. There we met a Birdtour Asia group with Jeff Peters, Neil Broekhuizen and their guide Wilbur Goh who showed us two Blue Nuthatches, the only ones of our trip. We had a good dinner and exchanged bird sightings with Jeff, Neil - "we tell you how you should pronounce your surname" - and Wilbur. In the evening the Brown Wood Owl returned. The Birdtour Asia group went out for night birding, Arjan and I went to sleep.

28 Febr

In the early morning (6:20) before dawn we waited at the Gate for the Malayan Whistling-Thrush to appear, but the bird did not show up. A male Large Niltava that walked the road caused some excitement, but at 7:20 we gave up. Neil, Jeff and Wilbur would see the species two days later, so it is still there. After this defeat we went first to the Hemmant Trail for Rusty-naped Pitta that was heard there a fortnight ago, but only an Orange-headed Thrush showed itself. Next we went to the Bishop's Trail again and there we had a long duel with a Rusty-naped Pitta that called from a deep gully with a large fallen tree in it which the Pitta obviously used to its advantage! After an hour or two we gave up. Other birds seen or heard where Lesser Shortwing, Large Scimitar Babbler, Silvereared Mesia, Green Magpie, Black-eared Shrike Babbler, a female Mugimaki Flycatcher, Rufousbrowed Flycatcher at close range, Buff-breasted Babbler, Mountain Fulvetta and Ochraceous Bulbul. At 11:00 we checked out at Stephen's Place, said goodbye and after a short birding at the Telecom Loop we went to Taman Negara. After almost two hours uneventful driving - with only White-throated Kingfishers seen - we realized that I had put the wrong east coordinate in the navigation system and that we were heading straight into oblivion, or the palm-oil deserts. It took us 1:45 minutes extra driving time, but we reached Kuala Tahan at around 17:00 hours. We took the ferry to the Mutiara Taman Negara Resort. We checked in and were given cabin 47. We ended birding the Swamp Loop and the Tahang Hide. Best birds were two Greater Slaty Woodpeckers,

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an invisible Sunda Scops Owl and four calling Hooded Pittas. After a nice dinner with a Tiger beer we tried the **Swamp Loop** again, but the Sunda Scops Owl made itself not visible and after searching in vain for Reddish Scops Owl we went to bed at 22:30 hours.

1 March

We started at 6:00 at the Swamp Loop to look for the Sunda Scops Owl again, but it stayed out of sight. Far away a Gould's Frogmouth called and a Hooded Pitta called nearby, but still in darkness. We had a quick breakfast and checked the fruiting tree at the HQ. Best birds were Little Green Pigeon, Streaked & Black-crested Bulbul and Asian Fairy-bluebird. We continued to walk the River Trail to Lubok Simpon with Blue-eared Kingfisher and Straw-headed Bulbul and next the Jenut Muda Trail. There is now an almost continuous boardwalk to the highest point, making birdwatching not easy as we could not prevent to make some noise. At the highest point we heard Great Argus, but it did not come into view. Best birds were Chestnut-rumped Babbler, Scalycrowned and Rufous-fronted Babblers, Sooty-capped & Chestnut-winged Babbler, Scarlet-rumped Trogon, Streaked Bulbul, Banded Woodpecker, Pint-tailed Tit-Babbler, Rhinoceros Hornbill, Germain's Swiftlets, Grey-rumped Treeswift and Banded Broadbill. We ended again at the Swamp Loop where a pair of Crested Firebacks was quickly found and a Banded Kingfisher was heard. We had a quick lunch and went back to the River Trail to walk as deep into the forest as possible, far away from the boardwalks. Straw-headed Bulbul were quite common and finally we found three Black-throated Babblers in a group of Scaly-crowned and Chestnut-winged Babblers. Another good bird was an Amur Paradise Flycatcher which we could compare with a nearby Blyth's Paradise Flycatcher. Also seen were Checker-throated Woodpecker, Black-and Yellow Broadbill, Squaretailed Drongo-Cuckoo, Dark-throated Oriole, Greater Green Leafbird, Spectacled & Ochraceous Bulbul, Blue-throated Bee-eater, White-bellied, Crimson-winged and Maroon Woodpeckers, Purple-naped Sunbird, Rufous-winged Philentoma and a hawk-cuckoo species that vanished all too quickly. Now we began being a little desperate since we had not heard a single Garnet or Malayan Banded Pitta, so on our way back we made the plan for tomorrow to go to the Blau Hide at the opposite side of the river. After a good dinner we did a short search around the cabins, but nothing was calling and we went to bed at 22:00 hours.

2 March

A pre-dawn walk at the Swamp Loop did not result in anything special, so we took breakfast and waited for the boat to arrive. The boat came as late as 8:00 and brought us to the Gua jetty. During the crossing we saw a pair of Black-and-red Broadbill, a lone Striated Heron, Chestnut-breasted Malkoha and Large Green Pigeons. We had plan to walk to the famous Blau Hide. The first stretch of good forest immediately resulted in good sightings of a pair of Large Wren Babbler, Short-tailed Babbler, Black-throated Babbler and Chestnut-winged Babbler. We also heard a Malayan Black Magpie that did not come into view. While continuing we found at the first bridge steaming dung and footprints of an elephant that were obviously not older than a few hours. Moreover we found several small trees ripped down and - too weird - a flipped-over wheelbarrow. A Malayan Banded Pitta called from opposite of the small stream, but we decided to return to the jetty, since we would not take any risk when a lone elephant was in the vicinity. We phoned the boats man who came immediately and at 10:00 hours we were back at the resort. Later on we learned that indeed a few weeks back tourists had been chased out of that patch of forest. We drank some coffee and judged our options. We decided to walk the Jenut Muda Trail via Bukit Teresek and then take the River Trail again. Along the Jenut Muda we saw or heard Banded Bay Cuckoo, Hairy-backed, Greycheeked and Grey-bellied Bulbul, Eastern Crowned and Arctic Warblers, Banded Woodpecker, Banded Kingfisher, Moustached and Sooty-capped Babbler and again Great Argus. Along the River trail we had Moustached Babbler, White-bellied Erpornis, Stork-billed Kingfisher, Little Spiderhunter, Blue-winged Leafbird, Scarlet-rumped and Red-naped Trogon, Green and Banded Broadbill and Square-tailed Drongo-Cuckoo. We met a German birder who had seen a Malayan Banded Pitta at the start of the River Trail that very morning, so we knew what we had to do the

next morning. We checked the place beforehand, but no pitta yet. After a good dinner we went to bed, feeling desperate of the prospect not seeing any pitta this holiday.

3 March

We rose early and walked to the camping grounds to look for Gould's Frogmouth. We heard no less than four birds but we could not get a single view of it, despite getting really close! Another Sunda Scops Owl refused to come closer. We waited also for the Malayan Banded Pitta to arrive, but we heard it only. We quickly went to the resort to fill our water bottles and ate as much as possible. We planned to walk the River Trail the whole day in a last desperate attempt to find Banded and Garnet Pitta. The first part we had Abbott's and Malayan Black-capped Babbler, Crested Jay (better to call it Jay Shrike), Spectacled Spiderhunter, Indian Cuckoo, Rufous-tailed Tailorbird, Banded Kingfisher, Oriental Dwarf Kingfisher, Rufous Piculet, Black-throated, Ferruginous and Chestnut-rumped Babbler, Black Magpie (again heard-only) and Buff-necked Woodpecker. Just before the road forks to the Tabing Hide, Arjan heard a Malayan Banded Pitta and we dove into cover and waited. We played its call once and the bird responded immediately. After waiting several minutes the bird, a male, came into view and showed itself very well! Happy with this result we walked towards the Tabing Hide. The short distance between the river and the hide produced Large Wren-Babbler, Green Broadbill, Greater Racket-tailed Drongo, Rufous-winged Philentoma, Indochinese Blue Flycatcher, Checker-throated Woodpecker, Rufous-crowned Babbler and Grey Wagtail. We checked the Tabing Hide and had planned to stay there for a short time, but we realized what a good place it was. Birds were plenty and seen at close range: Spotted Fantail, Black-and-red and Black-and-yellow Broadbills, Pin-striped Tit-Babblers, Brown Fulvetta, Eastern Crowned Warbler, White-bellied Erpornis, Black-naped Monarch and a perched Hodgson's Hawk-Cuckoo. A Puff-backed Bulbul was calling next to the hide and Arjan played the sound to get it back into view. The bulbul came close, but we were confused to hear the whistling of a Garnet Pitta. Was it on the sound recording of Peter Boesman or was there really a pitta whistling? It turned out that on the sound recording from Borneo a Black-headed Pitta was whistling in the background. But now, as the recording had stopped, a pitta was still whistling! We wanted to leave the hide immediately, but two Smooth-coated Otters appeared in the stream before the hide. Quickly we took some photos, but the pitta had priority, so we had to disturb the otters and went off trail into the bush. The Garnet Pitta was quickly found sitting on a large fallen log and it showed itself for some exciting minutes to both of us. At last we had him! We stayed another half hour in the hide again, while the pitta was whistling continuously. At 15:00 hours we slowly walked back along the River Trail adding Green Broadbill, Rufous-winged Philentoma, Greater Iora, Raffle's Malkoha, Rhinoceros Hornbill, Purple-naped Sunbird (Spiderhunter), Orange-backed and Buffnecked Woodpeckers, Blue-throated Bee-eater, Plaintive Cuckoo, Greater Coucal, Great Argus and Yellow-breasted Flowerpecker to our day list. A Malayan Peacock-Pheasant was calling beneath the river bank, but did not come into view. Back at the resort we had Asian Koel and Blue-crowned Hanging-Parrots. We birded the Tahang hide and the Swamp Loop till dusk. There we met Jeff, Neil and Wilbur again. Best birds there were Hill Myna, Large Green Pigeon, Little Green Pigeon, Brown-backed Needletail, Greater Slay Woodpecker, Javan Mynah, Fairy-bluebird and two Malayan Peacock-Pheasants (heard only). We had a good dinner again and after dinner we joined the Birdtour Asia group and exchanged information and addresses. Rain - the first serious rain we encountered - prevented a final search for frogmouths and owls, so at 22:30 we went to sleep.

4 March

The last morning we did a pre-dawn attempt for frogmouths and owls again at the Swamp Loop, but perhaps due to the rain nothing was responding. After breakfast we decided to stay as long as possible at the fruiting trees at the resort. Best birds were Black-winged Flycatcher-Shrike, Large Green Pigeon, Thick-billed Green Pigeon, Black-thighed Falconet, Oriental Dollarbird, Stork-billed Kingfisher, Blue-winged Leafbird, Spectacled, Buff-vented, Cream-vented, Black-crested, Yellow-vented and Red-eyed Bulbuls, Barred Cuckoo-Dove, Fairy-bluebird, Germain's Swiftlet, House Swift

and Brown-backed Needletails. From 9:30 till 10:30 we looked for Rufous-collared Kingfisher at the Swamp Loop, but in vain. We managed to find Crested Partridge and a fine Hooded Pitta (with brown cap). A little bit disappointing was the sight of Malayan Peacock-Pheasant that was wearing a metal ring, proving that it was one of the captive-raised birds. Finally we had to pack our bags, checked out and crossed the river for the final time. Our car was still in good health at the parking lot and after reorganizing the interior and double-checking the coordinates in the navigation system for our final destination – Kuala Lumpur, we drove south. Nothing special was seen, but in Kuala Lumpur we had some time left to visit the Lake Gardens, also known as Titiwangsa Park, a very crowded park, but our main quarry - Daurian Starling - was quickly found. Near the airport we checked a marsh for Pallas's Grasshopper Warbler, but only a Barred Buttonquail was flushed and seen by Arjan only. At around 19:30 hours we arrived at **Kuala Lumpur International Airport**, handed over the undamaged car to Hawk Car Rental, had a cheap but good dinner in the airport, checked in and waited for our plane to leave after midnight.

5 March

The Emirates flight EK343 to **Dubai** left on time at 1:10 and arrived at 4:30 in Dubai where we took the connecting flight EK147 at 8:10 hours. Both flights were with the huge and comfortable Airbus 380. We arrived on time at 12:40 at **Schiphol Airport Amsterdam**. We had to wait quite a long time for our bags, and yes of course, my bag was the very last one that came from the belt. So this was the end of our 7<sup>th</sup> trip. Arjan took the train to **Culemborg**, I took the train to **Alkmaar** and was home at 15:00 hours. Next year Manus Island, PNG?
